  - Descriptive representation (Celis and Childs, 2008)
- Women and planning
  - Women's needs considered within planning
  - Substantive representation (Celis and Childs, 2008)

# WOMEN IN PLANNING LEADERSHIP

- 1996 3% UK Heads of Planning in local authorities (Reeves, 1996)
- 1996 5% senior planning staff (Greed, 1996)
- 2018 39% RTPI members (Manns, 2019)
- 2019 17% Directors of planning consultancy firms (Women in Planning, 2019)

# THE EXPERIENCES OF WOMEN WORKING IN PLANNING

- 2017 RTPI members' survey
  - Less satisfaction reported
  - More barriers including gender and lack of family friendly policies
- 2019 RTPI research focused on gender
  - 'Masculine' norms and cultures
  - Impact of promotion
  - Sexist and inappropriate comments
  - Maternity discrimination

# WOMEN AND PLANNING – (BRIEF) HISTORY

- 'Men with maps and models'
- Women were not thought of in planning
- Feminist critique
  - Delores Hayden (1980) 'What would a non-sexist city look like?'
  - Clara Greed (1994) Women and Planning
- A need to consider women's needs
- Shifting demographics in practice

#### LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT UK

- Late 1990s gender mainstreaming
  - Amsterdam Treaty 1997
  - "In respect of the application to local planning authorities, it may be defined as the process whereby gender issues, relations, power differentials and identities are taken into account within all stages and aspects of the plan-making process." (Greed, 2006, p. 179)
- Equalities Act 2010
- Public Sector Equality Duty (includes planning depts.)
- Equality Impact Assessments

## **EXAMPLES OF PRACTICE - VIENNA**

- Gender sensitive planning (1990s)
  - Political priority
  - Key individuals
  - Women's Office/Coordination office focused on planning for needs of women
  - Pilot projects to inform and influence
    - Streetscapes
    - Parks
    - Housing projects

# **EXAMPLES OF PRACTICE - BARCELONA**

- Punt 6 project (current day)
  - Toilets
  - Playgrounds
  - Transport
  - Superblock
  - Seating
  - Night time safety
