The metric used to measure the value of development is often distilled down to money, yet more and more developers are starting to assess their value in a different way – addressing the "triple bottom line" of environmental, social and economic sustainability.

Addressing a development's social and environmental impact requires a more nuanced assessment of value and "highest and best use".
